## To Recognize October 16-22, 2023 as Digital Citizenship Week

- WHEREAS, the State Standards adopted by the California Board of Education for English Language Arts require that students in grades K-12 must use technology, including the internet, to produce and publish their work and to interact and collaborate with others:
- WHEREAS, the use of the internet in schools and at home is an important learning tool for students because it gives them access to the world's resources;
- WHEREAS, according to the Pew Research Center, 92 percent of teens report going online daily, including 24 percent who say they go online "almost constantly," and 71 percent report using more than one social networking site;
- WHEREAS, the use of the internet involves risks such as cyberbullying and the violation of privacy, which can be greatly reduced when students learn how to use it safely and responsibly;
- WHEREAS, state and federal laws specify that students must know how to appropriately interact with one another in chat rooms and other social networking sites;
- as a result of COVID-19 students across Los Angeles County and the nation WHEREAS. had to engage daily in online teaching and learning;
- WHEREAS, students must learn how to safely use all learning tools, including technology and digital information and media, to be college and career ready, especially in today's digital world.
