WHAT IS IT?

Hazard mitigation refers to actions taken to reduce or eliminate long-term risks caused by hazards or disasters, such as flooding, earthquakes, wildfires, extreme heat or drought. It includes sustainable measures that minimize the impact of disasters and enhance resilience. To support this effort, the Los Angeles County Office of Education Local Hazard Mitigation Plan will be developed to address long term strategies to protect the LACOE community and its critical assets.
