




Homeless children and youth, from birth through 12th grade, were identified and served across 80 school districts and 371 charter schools.

The data presented in this infographic is sourced from the California Annual Homeless Education Data Collection, reported by Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) for the 2023-2024 school year. It is crucial to acknowledge that the reported number of students may be an undercount, due to the complexities of identifying and documenting homelessness among students. This issue is highlighted in the California State Auditor's report[1], which also revealed that many LEAs identified less than 5 percent of economically disadvantaged youth as homeless, a benchmark frequently used by homeless education experts to estimate the likely number of students experiencing homelessness at any given time. 1.California State Auditor.
