








One in 21 students experienced homelessness in 2024-25.




ENROLLMENT BY RACE AND ETHNICITY

ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE AND OUTCOMES

Students experiencing homelessness often face greater academic challenges than other socioeconomically similar peers, highlighting the unique obstacles they encounter.
